

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

As we look at our calendars, we realize that Ash Wednesday is a mere three days away. During the season of Lent, we are all called as Christians to take a personal inventory of our spiritual and everyday lives. It is time to ask ourselves many questions.

- Where is my relationship with God?
- Do I live out the Gospel of love for my family each day?
- Do I forgive those who offended me or do I hold grudges?
- Am I prejudice against people with different colored skin and backgrounds?
- Do I try to correct the sins in my life or do I accept them and continue to make the same mistakes?

Traditionally, many Catholics have always seen Lent as a time to abstain and "give up" things; sweets, television programs, movies and other pleasurable activities. This behavior is fine, but we must remember that Lent is a call to action, a time to improve our lives by living more in tune with the Gospel. It is a time to erase hate and sin with acts of charity, compassion, forgiveness and love. I pray that all of us collectively as a parish community accept our Lord's challenge and make a commitment to improve our daily and spiritual lives.

During this prayerful season of Lent, remember our daily Mass schedule of 8:30AM, Monday thru Friday, and 8:00AM on Saturday. Stations of the Cross will be celebrated every Friday during Lent at 7:00PM. You can find our Ash Wednesday schedule on the cover of today's bulletin.

Please mark your calendars for our Lenten Parish Mission which will be on March 25th at 7:00pm. As I stated in a previous bulletin, this year we will only have a one day Mission which will feature Mr. Jim Walker performing a one man play called *Peter the Rock*. This play portrays the life of the apostle Peter and tells of his journey with Jesus. Since I first mentioned this one day Mission in the bulletin on January 26th, I talked to several priests who had Mr. Walker and they and their parishioners thoroughly enjoyed the presentation.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION



One of the things that older pastors and younger priests occasionally quarrel about is the proper balance between work and prayer. I know one pastor who complains that his younger associate ignores the people and the parish because he wants to spend more time in prayer. And the young priest complains that the pastor gives him too much work to do and no time to pray. The Lord's words this Sunday speak into this tension with an image that can help us find a proper balance between life and prayer.

Jesus says, "For every tree is known by its fruit. For people do not pick figs from thorn bushes, nor do they gather grapes from brambles" (Luke 6:44). When we are deeply rooted and cultivating our relationship with Jesus, we are going to bear the fruit of that love in our lives.

No fruit, no good prayer. How do we know that we are praying well? We are experiencing concrete fruits of love for others in our lives.

Someone who prays well will, sooner or later, burst forth the "figs" and "grapes" of acts of love. But without concrete commitment to deeds of selfless service to others, our prayer time is as useless as thorn bushes and brambles. Let's recommit ourselves to be men and women of prayer and service. And hopefully the pastors will help their associates to pray and serve fruitfully...with minimal quarreling.

WHAT IS LENT?

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years old and older on all Fridays of Lent.

The Paschal Fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and is encouraged to continue until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday Night). This special fast is to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

When fasting, a person may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

CONFIRMATION COMMITMENT

Many families will keep a copy of this bulletin, as a reminder of this special day of Confirmation with their child's name posted. We use this as an opportunity to remind those newly confirmed to use the gifts of the Holy Spirit. They are the leaders of society in the not too distant future. The years of high school and college pass quickly. Like the seeds that lie motionless in fertile ground, germinating, cracking open their shell, so too, these next eight years are the years for your faith to germinate and grow. Stay close to Christ. Stay close to your faith. We are united in helping you to be the best version of yourself with the gifts of the Holy Spirit to help you be good leaders of our future. You have received a blessing from God, now be a blessing from God to all whom you meet.



How do we fast?

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.

Fifth graders were given the task to identify three unknown white powder substances by observing physical and chemical reactions.











Seventh grade science students visited the fourth graders to challenge them to building the tallest marshmallow tower.


