## FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Our Lenten Parish Reconciliation Service will be celebrated on Tuesday, March 24<sup>th</sup> at 7:00PM. Receiving God's forgiving love and grace in this sacrament is another way we make ourselves right with our Lord.

All parish families should have received the annual St. Alexander Easter Letter and Schedule in the mail. I ask that everyone please take notice of the schedule of Easter services, Masses, and reconciliation times. The liturgies of Holy Week and Easter are the most spirited, moving, and meaningful celebrations of the year as they recall the passion, death, and resurrection of our Savior. The Easter schedule is also listed on page eight. I hope and pray that your Lenten journey thus far has grown you closer in your relationship with God. Remember Lent ends on Holy Thursday with the celebration of the Mass of Our Lord's Supper. Please take time each day as we conclude this Lenten season to pray and to ask our Lord to shower us with his blessings so that we may serve one another as Christ serves us in the Eucharist.

Please remember we are in need of parishioners to volunteer to have their foot washed on Holy Thursday. The sign-up sheet is in the narthex of the church. This is a perfect way for you to partake in a special way in celebrating the gift of the Holy Eucharist and our dedication to be modern day apostles of Christ.

During this prayerful season of Lent, remember our daily Mass at 8:30AM Monday through Friday, and 8:00AM on Saturdays. Stations of the Cross will be celebrated at 7:00PM every Friday during Lent. The Stations of the Cross on March 27<sup>th</sup> will be a special version of our Lord's Passion as seen through the eyes of His Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Over two years ago we scheduled Fr. Ron Hoye to present this year's Parish Mission. As you recall, Fr. Hoye is an excellent speaker and blessed us with an excellent Mission eight years ago. Unfortunately we at the parish received a call from Fr. Hoye a month and a half ago that he was ill and was told by the doctor to cancel all ministerial activities. It is hard to get a good mission speaker on short notice and thus we will have no Parish Mission this year. Please keep Fr. Hoye in your prayers and I thank you for your understanding. Several parishioners have turned in the mission envelope in the Sunday collection. Please know this money will be used wisely to support the outreach ministry to the needy at our parish.

## SCRIPTURE REFLECTION



A friend of mine wrote an imaginative reflection on the raising of Lazarus that caught me off guard. She proposed that when Jesus called Lazarus from the tomb, the man was not joyful but angry and annoyed. After so much suffering, maybe death felt like a release. He had finally escaped the pain. And then, suddenly, Jesus' voice cuts through the silence: "Lazarus, come out!" (John 11:43) The light stings his eyes. The pain returns. And now he is dragged back into a world that had broken him.

It startled me at first, but the more I sat with it, the more it made sense. Sometimes, people do not want to be raised. Not at first. Think of those in the grip of addiction, despair, or numbness. The tomb can feel safer than the risk of living again. Yet Jesus, moved by the grief and faith of others (Martha, Mary, the community) calls the dead man out. Lazarus obeys. But he is still bound, head to foot. Jesus says to the bystanders, "Untie him and let him go" (John 11:44). That is often how healing happens: slowly, reluctantly. Not just by a personal decision, but through the love and persistence of others. Resurrection is not always euphoric. It may begin in protest and confusion and only later turn to gratitude and freedom. But Christ's voice breaks through, anyway.

Lenten challenge: Who in your life needs to be called back to life? Pray for them. If that person is you, listen for the voice. It is calling even now.

**LENTEN REGULATIONS**

Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years old and older on all Fridays of Lent.

The Paschal Fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and is encouraged to continue until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday Night). This special fast is to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

When fasting, a person may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
