## FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Please keep our second grade school and RE children in your prayers this week as they prepare to celebrate their First Holy Communion on Saturday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>. Most of us adults remember the first time we received our Lord when we were children and recall how special that day was. Boys dressed in new suits, girls in white dresses with veils, receiving our first hard cover prayer book and rosary, and all the relatives who came to celebrate this special day. As we go forth in our faith journey let us receive Jesus in this sacrament with the reverence and feeling of joy that we experienced on the day of our First Holy Communion.

We refer to our Lord Jesus Christ as the Bread of Life, Christ the King, The Prince of Peace, Christ Our Savior, Lamb of God, and many other titles. One of the beautiful terms we use when we refer to Jesus is The Good Shepherd. What a loving, caring, and nurturing term for Jesus as we realize He is always watching and protecting, we, His sheep. We are never lost when we follow The Good Shepherd. Jesus shepherds us out of love, and not out of duty, like a hired hand.

The difference between The Good Shepherd and the hired hand is the difference between life and death. Unlike a hired hand who only works for pay and would run away at the first sign of difficulty, Jesus is a Good Shepherd who willingly lays down his life for his sheep. The Good Shepherd draws the sheep near to him. They belong to him—not as a possession that can be discarded, but as precious ones who are assured that they can rely on His care and protection. The sheep owe their very lives to the Shepherd. Without him, they will be scattered and left on their own in what is often a dangerous world.

No sheep with any sense would wander off and leave the fold. The Shepherd provides food and safety. Away from the fold, the sheep risks death in the jaws of wolves or starvation in the desert. Jesus is The Good Shepherd and invites us to be good sheep. Jesus has experienced the best and the worst of all that life has in store. He has known the simple joys and deep disappointments of life; he has known temptation, anxiety, and fatigue. Jesus walks ahead of us, leading the way. We may be tempted to wander away, lured by the temporary pleasures and tempted by the illusion of something better over the horizon. In the noise of daily life, surrounded by messages that compete with God and God's ways, it is easy to become distracted from what is important and lasting. Jesus, our Good Shepherd, invites us to be good sheep who are so close to him that we hear and recognize his voice. As good sheep, we are called to follow the voice of the Shepherd, trusting that he will guide us to the best pasture, where we can thrive.

**SCRIPTURE REFLECTION**



“I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.” John 10:11

My most boring job was working at an insurance company as a college student. My main task? Filing. Now imagine if I had told my supervisor, “I just want you to know, I’m willing to die for these files.” She would have called a psychiatrist — or at least security.

There is something absurd in Jesus’ words in today’s Gospel: “I am the good shepherd... I lay down my life for the sheep.” (John 10:11) It sounds noble, until you think about it. No one dies for sheep. Not a hired hand. Not even a good shepherd. Sheep are important, sure, but not worth a human life.

And yet, Jesus insists: I will die for them. The crowd understandably responds: “He is out of his mind.”

C.S. Lewis once said that Jesus does not leave us the option of calling him merely a good teacher. If someone speaks like him, he is either lying, crazy, or telling the truth. John’s Gospel won’t let us stay sentimental. Jesus means it. He reveals a love that surpasses logic — a love that measures worth not by strength or success, but by the willingness to suffer unto death.

The Good Shepherd’s madness is mercy. His cross makes no earthly sense and yet it makes divine sense. He lays down his life not for kings or saints but for sheep — for the ordinary, the unworthy, for you and me.

Think of someone who may feel unworthy of love. Do something simple and generous for them, not because they deserve it, but because Jesus did the same for you.

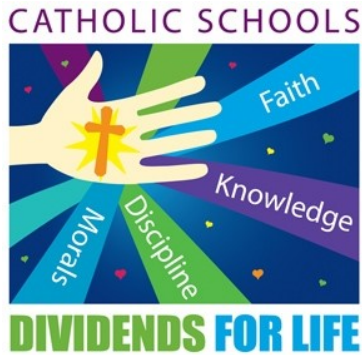

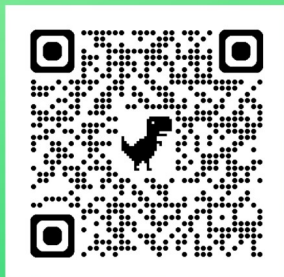
