

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Christ's bodily Ascension foreshadows our own entrance into Heaven not simply as souls, after our death, but as glorified bodies, after the resurrection of the dead at the Final Judgement. In redeeming mankind, Christ not only offered salvation to our souls, but began the restoration of the material world itself in the glory that God intended before Adam's fall.

The Feast of the Ascension marks the beginning of the first novena, or nine days of prayer. Before His Ascension, Christ promised to send the Holy Spirit to His apostles. Their prayer for the coming of the Holy Spirit, which began on Ascension Thursday, ends with the descent of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Sunday, next Sunday.

Monday, June 2nd, is the 105th anniversary of the birth of St. John Paul II. As Pope, we recall that St. John Paul was instrumental in bringing down communism in Eastern Europe as he worked with other world leaders. In most countries communism fell with protests that were held in a peaceful manner. Let us pray that our country will take the example of St. John Paul II and achieve a change of heart amongst people without violence, and in a peaceful way. Let us all pray for Pope Leo XIV as he now guides the church and the world to a path of peace and freedom.

Next weekend there will be a second collection for PRMAA, which is the Priest's Retirement and Mutual Aid Association, of the Archdiocese of Chicago. Your generosity to this campaign impacts our many active and retired archdiocesan priests which serve the many parishes and ministries of the Church of Chicago. In advance I thank you for your generosity.

Today our bulletin cover honors the twenty seven young men and women who have completed their grammar school education at St. Alexander School. This past Wednesday, May 28th, we honored the St. Alexander's Graduating Class of 2025 at a special Mass and ceremony. The priests, parish staff, school staff, and all parishioners are very proud of the many accomplishments our graduating students have achieved during their grammar school years here. Many thanks to Mrs. O'Toole, our Principal, the faculty, parents, and all who dedicate themselves to help educate and send their children to our fine school.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION



The famous 20th century St. Padre Pio said once that he would wait outside the gates of heaven until the people in his life had entered. I'm not sure that I, or frankly many people I know, would say that and mean it. Yet that is precisely the kind of attitude we see in Jesus as he prays for us in the Gospel today. Having celebrated the Ascension of the Lord just a few days ago, we now hear the Son of God at the Last Supper pray to his Father "that they may be brought to perfection as one" (John 17:23). What does this mean for us?

I'd wager that we are not surprised that Jesus wants to make us perfect — that is, happy, whole, and healed. The shocker is that he desires this for us collectively and not just individually. Perfection is a team sport. We need each other to be perfect. Jesus is like a mother longing for her adult children to learn how to be in loving support of one another. He wants the perfection of his disciples to be not some individualistic plan of moral uprightness, but a loving communion of brothers and sisters.

Let's apply this practically. Do I see my participation at Mass as something I do merely for my own peace and edification, or as something I do with and for the people around me? Do I see my ongoing need for forgiveness as something that simply makes me feel better, or as a task that heals those around me, too? Is my dearest hope to individually get to heaven when I die, or is it to be part of the great procession of souls, together marching towards the heavenly Jerusalem? Do I want to be in heaven with people I currently find difficult? How would my life change if I did?




