FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today's second collection is for PRMAA, which is the Priest's Retirement and Mutual Aid Association, of the Archdiocese of Chicago. Your generosity to this campaign impacts our many active and retired archdiocesan priests who serve the many parishes and ministries of the Church of Chicago. Please turn to page five of today's bulletin and read Cardinal Cupich's letter on this important collection.

Fr. Mitchell and I will be away from the parish on Monday morning, June 15th through Thursday, June 18th for the Priest Convocation which will be held at the Grand Geneva Resort in Lake Geneva, Wisconsin. Every two or three years, Cardinal Cupich requires all active priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago (the retired priests are also invited, but it is not required) to gather together as fellow priests for prayer, lectures, spiritual exercises, and community building. Morning Mass will be celebrated on Monday and Friday. Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday our deacons will have a prayer service at 8:30am which will consist of the Liturgy of the Word and Holy Communion. In the meantime please keep Fr. Mitchell, our supply priests, and myself in your prayers during the convocation as you will be in ours.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION



A few years ago, I met a woman in my parish who was a successful lawyer. Yet in her free time, she poured her energy into a nonprofit she founded to advocate for children with special needs. When I asked what inspired her, she spoke of her niece, who was born with disabilities. Her niece was both a glorious gift and a constant challenge. Out of that painful, beautiful experience, she felt called to create something lasting for other children and parents. The nonprofit thrived, not because she had mapped it all out, but because she was deeply moved to act.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is **"moved with compassion" for the crowd, for they were "like sheep without a shepherd."** (Matthew 9:36) So he calls his disciples, ordinary men with no special qualifications, and sends them to heal, preach, and cast out demons. Their mission flows not from their skills but from his authority and the Spirit's gifts.

The Second Vatican Council teaches that the Spirit continually pours out charisms, special graces for the good of the Church and the world (cf. Lumen Gentium 4 & 12). These often arise from the unfolding of our lives: from what breaks your heart, what fills you with hope, what suffering has shaped you. The Spirit works through those very experiences to equip us with gifts that build up others.

What is your charism? Well, what needs around you call you to loving action? This could be where Christ is sending you. Allow your heart to be moved like Christ's. Then get to work.

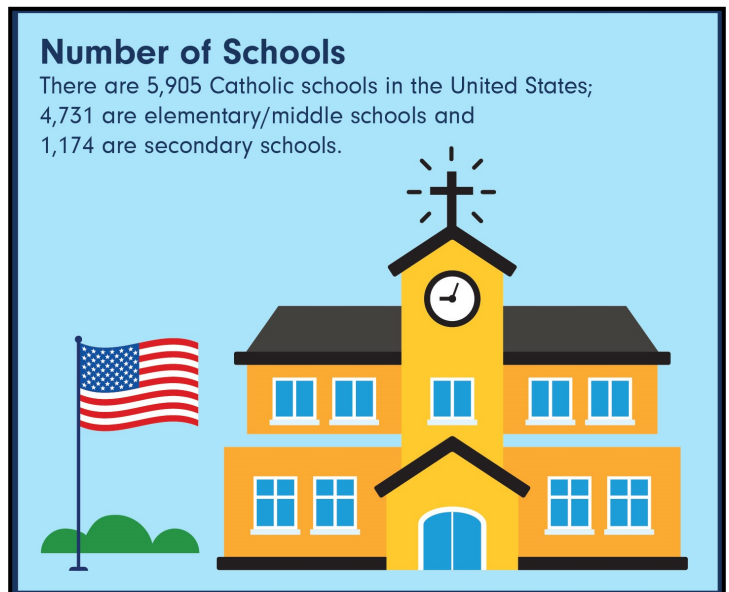
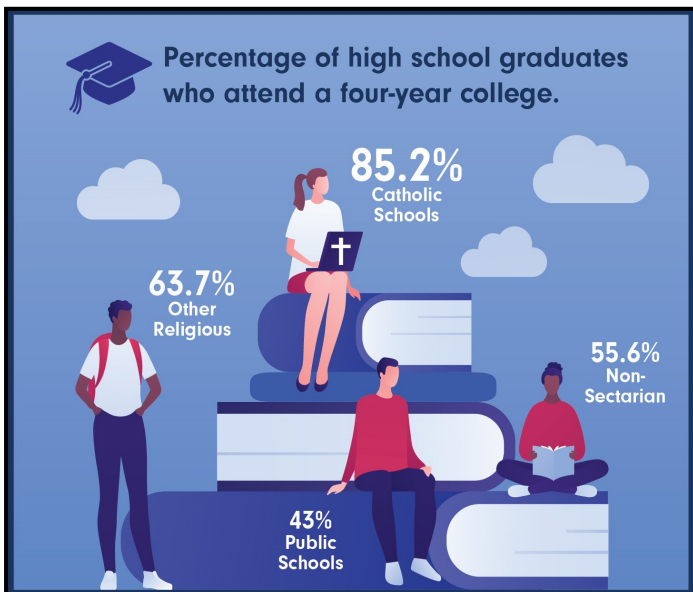

3. Your children are learning about the Catholic faith. *(You'd like to learn more about this faith tradition, still unsure if you'd like to become a Catholic..)*
4. You've lived in a "Catholic world" all your life, so people assume you are already Catholic. *(You'd like to find out if you are closer than you think in mind and heart.)*
5. You don't know much about Catholicism, but a friend or neighbor has inspired you to learn more. *(With no strings attached, this is a wonderful way to check things out.)*
6. You have experienced personal loss or family struggles. *(You are seeking ways to deepen your spiritual life by exploring the Catholic faith tradition.)*

You don't know why, but you feel something urging you to the Catholic Church. *(It's probably the Holy Spirit.)*

COMMUNITY DINNER RECIPE

The recipe below was served at April's Community Dinner. Many enjoyed it and asked for the recipe.

CLASSIC FRENCH TOAST CASSEROLE

9 x 13 Pan 12-15 Servings

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 loaf brioche, challah, or Texas toast cubed (about 12-16 oz.)
- 8 large eggs
- 2 cups milk
- 1/2 cup heavy cream
(optional but makes it richer)
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1—1 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp salt

OPTIONAL TOPPING: *(highly recommended)*

- 4 tbsp butter, melted
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- Extra sprinkle of cinnamon

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Prep the bread
 - Cut or tear into cubes (about 1 inch)
 - Spread evenly in a greased 9 x 13 pan
2. Make the custard
 - Whisk together eggs, milk, cream sugar, vanilla, cinnamon, salt
3. Combine
 - Pour over bread evenly
 - Press down gently so all pieces soak
4. Chill
 - Cover and refrigerate at least 4 hours
(better overnight)

BAKE:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- Cover with foil and bake 30 minutes
- Uncover and bake 15-25 more minutes
- Done when center is set (not wet) and top is golden

MAKE-IT-BETTER TIPS:

- Slightly stale bread = way better texture
- Want it sweeter? Add a drizzle of maple syrup before serving
- Want it softer? Bake a little less
- Want it firmer for clean slice? Bake a bit longer

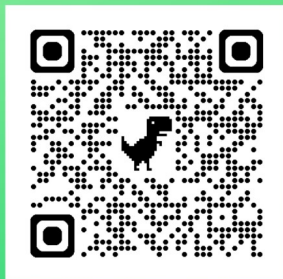

Assisted Listening Systems for Church Sound

Our church is equipped with a hearing “loop” system which will allow those with a tele-coil (T-coil) in their hearing aid to hear more clearly. Some hearing aids will automatically switch to our “loop” system. Other hearing aids must be *manually* switched to the T-coil mode.

If you do not think your hearing aid is functioning properly with our “loop” system it may be because: A) Your hearing aid does not have a built-in T-coil OR B) You have to *manually* switch your hearing aid to the T-coil mode.

T-Coil Switches: If your hearing aid has a switch labeled **M-T-O** the switch should be set to the **T** position. If your hearing aid has switch labeled **M-MT** the switch should be set to the **MT** position.

Please consult your Audiologist with any questions, and to be sure that your hearing aid is equipped with a T-coil and is working properly.

If you do not have a hearing aid with tele-coil (T-coil), we have purchased four individual hearing devices, specifically programmed for our system, that can be used during our liturgies on Sunday. They will be placed in a box on the bench outside the school office. We do ask that you please clean the hearing device after Mass, with the alcohol wipes that are on the bench, before returning them to the box. Thank you and we hope this will help to enhance your liturgical experience.
