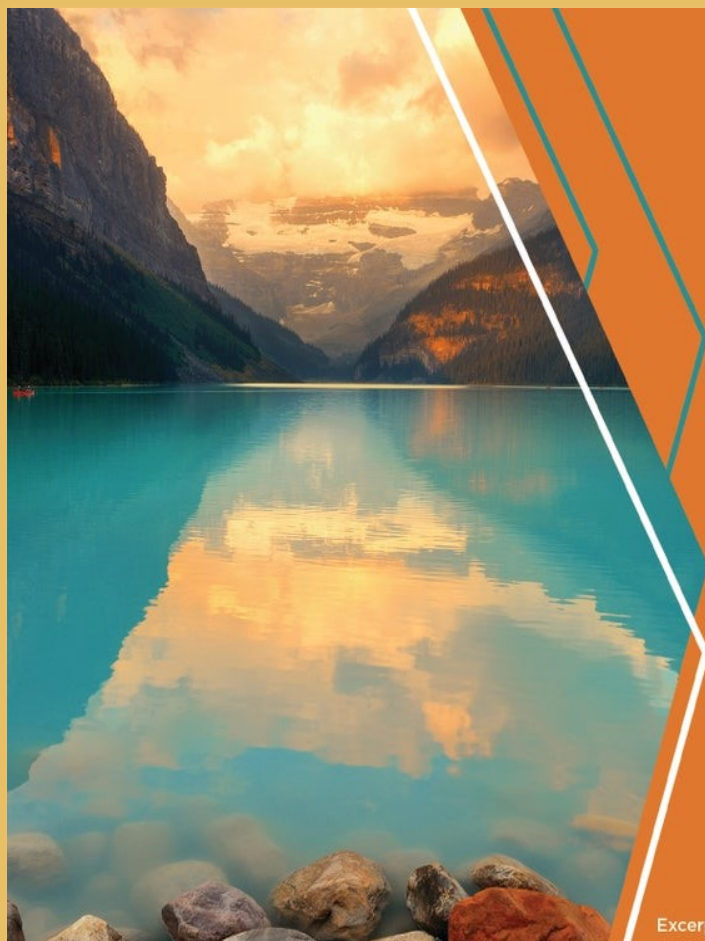

BAPTISM

Celebration of Entrance into Christ's Church

You should be a registered parishioner of St. Alexander, or willing to register and join our Faith Community. Relatives of St. Alexander parishioners are also welcome.

At least one Godparent must be a practicing Catholic. The other must be a Christian. Parents must register for a class on Baptism **BEFORE** your baby is baptized. Archdiocesan required classes are held once a month, usually on the first Tuesday of the month, and facilitated by trained parishioners.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The heat of the summer is upon us. Unfortunately with the heat of the summer, Sunday Mass attendance does have a tendency to drop off a bit. Some of this is due to summer vacations and some is due to the attitude that one can take a “vacation” from church. Please remember and remind parishioners and children throughout the year that we should all gather each week as a community to worship our Lord, give thanks and appreciate the fact we are one unified community striving to live the life of the Gospel. We are a strong, faith-based parish at St. Alexander and we need to worship each and every Sunday. As we evangelize to others it is vital that we support our parish and one another.

If you are away for the weekend or on an extended vacation, please find a local Catholic church and worship there. Check out the notice on this page for apps you can download. If you are unable to attend Mass at St. Alexander’s, I ask that you please remember to drop your missed Sunday envelopes in the next collection basket, drop them at the parish office, or in the mail.

Please remember Palos Hospital does not have a full-time priest chaplain on staff. They have employed various priests to celebrate daily and weekend Masses which are televised into patient rooms. Although one or two part-time retired priests are occasionally ministering in the hospital they are not always available or present. If you plan on going to the hospital for surgery or another medical procedure and would like to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick please call the parish office and ask for Fr. Colm Mitchell or myself. We will be more than glad to come to your house or you can come to the Parish Administrative Center and we can celebrate the Sacrament at that time. Also, we are available to anoint you after any weekday or Sunday Mass. Please remember that the Anointing of the Sick also takes place after the 5:00 PM evening Mass on the first Saturday of the month when we have Individual Prayer Opportunity and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Also, we are more than willing to anoint our parishioners at Palos Hospital. Unfortunately the chaplains from hospice do not always inform us when somebody is ill and needs to be anointed. Many still think the sacrament is the Last Rites. For many years it has been the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. It is much more meaningful for the person to be anointed if they are conscious and aware that they are receiving the Sacrament of Healing from our Lord. Once again, please do not hesitate to call us at St. Alexander if you or a loved one would like to receive this beautiful sacrament.

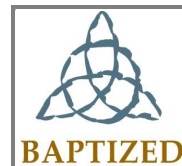

**SCRIPTURE
REFLECTION**

In the days after the awful 2020 killing of George Floyd, a Catholic friend remarked, “Racism is today’s great evil. We should put all our energy into fighting it.” I admired her intuition that the church must stand firmly against evil. Amen, I thought. At the same time, something felt wrong. As months went by, I saw her steadily slide into bitterness and anger. Soon, despondency. She spoke of giving up the fight. Don’t we too wonder how to fight evil without losing our joy or energy?

Jesus’ words this week help. He says, “Rejoice not that you have power over demons, but that your names are written in heaven” (Luke 10:20). Notice the asymmetry in where he wants our focus: on the latter, not the former. Should we confidently embrace our God-given power to overcome evil? Absolutely. But even more so, we should emphasize the positive element of our relationship to God. It is tempting but dangerous to define ourselves by what we oppose. It is better to define ourselves by—to rejoice in—what we celebrate: in Jesus, God has written our names in heaven. This sustains our battles.

This week, our marching orders are: fight evil. But more deeply, rejoice that God knows and loves us personally, individually. We allow this joyful knowledge to undergird our fight against the darkness of our day. Then we enjoy long-term stability to be cheerful warriors, who never forget the reason for the contests we are called to fight and win: love.

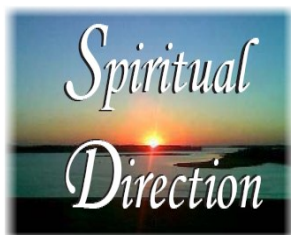

Opportunity for Spiritual Direction

Christian Spiritual Direction is an ancient spiritual discipline that is a way of companioning people as they seek to look closely, through the eyes of their heart, at the guidance and transforming work of God in their lives. Direction is given by one believer to another and helps the seeker to respond to the Holy Spirit's communication by living out this relationship with God. The focus of this type of spiritual direction is on experience, not ideas, and specifically on the religious dimension of experience.

Moreover, experiences are viewed as an expression of the ongoing personal relationship God has established with each one of us. The director is considered a gentle guide in this process. Spiritual direction meetings take place once a month in a one on one setting. Prayer, silence, and listening are used to assist the seeker in discerning the movement of the Holy Spirit in their lives. All conversations take place in strict confidentiality.

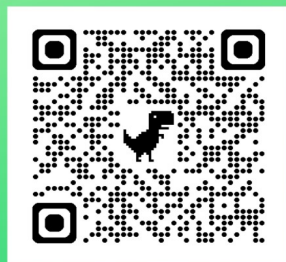

(OCIA means The Order of Christian Initiation for Adults)

1. You're marrying a Catholic. *(Sharing and practicing your faith together is a great foundation for married life.)*
2. You're already married to a Catholic and your children are being raised Catholic. *(It's natural to want to feel a closer bond by sharing in the sacraments with family.)*
3. Your children are learning about the Catholic faith. *(You'd like to learn more about this faith tradition, still unsure if you'd like to become a Catholic..)*
4. You've lived in a "Catholic world" all your life, so people assume you are already Catholic. *(You'd like to find out if you are closer than you think in mind and heart.)*
5. You don't know much about Catholicism, but a friend or neighbor has inspired you to learn more. **(With no strings attached, this is a wonderful way to check things out.)**
6. You have experienced personal loss or family struggles. *(You are seeking ways to deepen your spiritual life by exploring the Catholic faith tradition.)*

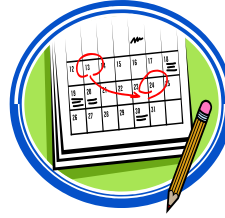

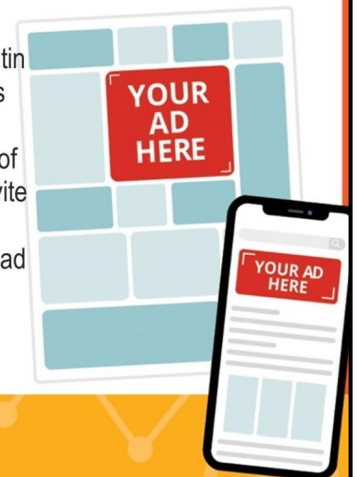
