

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Many times throughout the year you will notice the initials OCIA mentioned in the bulletin. OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults. It is a program designed for adults who are interested in joining the Catholic faith. The OCIA program also helps those who are in need of sacraments. This program is geared to those who have never been baptized, those who were baptized in another faith or those who are in need of the sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Eucharist or Confirmation. This year's OCIA classes will begin in October and conclude a few weeks after the Easter Vigil in 2026. If you or anyone you know is interested in joining the Catholic faith or receiving any sacraments, please contact our OCIA director, Deacon Mike Ciciura at 708-448-4861.

As I stated in last week's bulletin St. Alexander School will return on Monday, August 25th, Religious Education program begins in September, and many young people are returning to college. This weekend we celebrate Mission Sunday at St. Alexander Parish and are blessed to have a member of the Order of The Sisters of the Imitation of Christ (aka Bethany Sisters). Currently the Order brings the word of God to those in need in nine countries in four different continents. The congregation was established in September of 1925 and was raised into pontifical status in August of 1956. The sisters run many missions in remote areas where children are deprived of basic education and many families face economic hardship. The sisters provide early education for over fifty children in each village they serve, but they need help to build a permanent study center. Your support will provide children with a safe space to learn, grow, and build a bright future. The Bethany Sisters will share the importance of being generous to the missions as we as a Catholic church continue to grow throughout the world bringing the word of Christ and meeting the temporal needs of people who are in need. Today's second collection will be for the missions. If you forgot your envelope you can place it in next week's collection.

Please mark you calendar for this year's Annual Parish Picnic which will be held on September 7th. Food (hamburgers, hotdogs, chips, water, etc.) will all be free of charge. There will be plenty of activities for both children and adults. We will also have a DJ to provide music, the egg toss, musical chairs, our popcorn machine, Bingo, and ice cream for dessert. This is the perfect opportunity for us to gather as parishioners of all ages to celebrate God's gift that we have here at St. Alexander Parish.

Maybe things would be more peaceful devoid of these seemingly arbitrary difficulties. But for us who believe in the one who comes to set the earth of fire, we should be much more worried if he stops demanding so much from us. In fact, let's thank him for it. He sees how glorious we can become.





- 2. You're already married to a Catholic and your children are being raised Catholic. (It's natural to want to feel a closer bond by sharing in the sacraments with family.)
- 3. Your children are learning about the Catholic faith. (You'd like to learn more about this faith tradition, still unsure if you'd like to become a Catholic..)
- 4. You've lived in a "Catholic world" all your life, so people assume you are already Catholic. (You'd like to find out if you are closer than you think in mind and heart.)


