FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

After celebrating Labor Day, having our parish picnic and welcoming our children back to school we realize this summer is soon coming to an end. As we enter the autumn season many of us are frustrated, angry, burned out, lonely and are experiencing many different feelings and worries. How do we deal with the stresses and strains of our lives during these difficult times? How do we deal with people who intrude upon our space and our peacefulness? What do we do when faced with chaos? Do we turn outwardly in anger or do we turn inwardly to find the peace of God? We truly need to be in touch with our feelings. We need to say we are angry, confused, bewildered, empty, or whatever. We also need to get in touch with what grounds us as a whole human being.

Centering or focusing ourselves on God is one way to find peace in the midst of turmoil. It takes a little time to get centered and focused and it takes time to get in touch with God. Let us all make sure that we take time and find the peace of God within ourselves. There are many ways to achieve this peace of God, and the best way to do this is through daily prayer, reflection, and celebrating Mass in our beautiful church.

This coming week we welcome back all students in our Religious Education Program. I pray that this will be once again a successful year for our students and volunteer teachers. We have an excellent program and if you know of anybody looking for an RE program in our area please tell them to call the Parish Office at 708-448-4861. If you are interested in becoming a volunteer teacher please contact the Parish Office. Please know that you will be trained and you are certainly worthy of participating in this ministry when you use the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Many times throughout the year we receive requests for services from people we do not know. Many of these requests entail a moral obligation. We are asked to verify that a person is a practicing Catholic; we are asked to marry someone who is not registered in the parish. There is a Church law that requires a pastor know the people before he gives information or permission for any sacrament. It is quite difficult and embarrassing at times to question people unnecessarily. Often the people concerned become upset. There is an easy solution to these problems; become a registered, known, contributing, and active parishioner. Young people need to register in the parish in which they reside. Once a person finishes school, gets a job, or is married, they take on a new identity and a new home. They no longer come under the registration of their parents. Much grief can be avoided by registering, so PLEASE register. It will be of great help if one would like to receive a sacrament at St. Alexander or obtain a letter of recommendation to become a sponsor for Confirmation or Baptism. You may call 708-448-4861, or stop by the Parish Administrative Center to register.

Our next Community Dinner of the year will be held on Tuesday, September 15th at 6:00 pm in our Parish Center. Last year's dinners were a great success with delicious food and fellow parishioners making new friends. Please plan on joining us as we continue to build community at St. Alexander. SCRIPTURE REFLECTION



In my parish, there was once a new employee who frequently told me she was sorry for various imperfections in her work. It could be a little tiring. I finally told her, "You know, you don't have to say 'sorry' so often." She looked me right in the eyes and said, "Father, you're right. I'm sorry." Her ear-to-ear grin betrayed that she enjoyed the irony — and that she would keep asking for forgiveness as often as she needed it.

The Gospel reading this week proclaims to us that God, in Jesus, delights in numerous requests for, and the granting of, forgiveness. To Peter's question, "**Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive? As many as seven times?**" Jesus responds, "**I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times.**" In other words, Peter, stop counting.

Christian life should be marked by a commitment to frequent forgiveness. God never tires of forgiving us. His limitless love has overcome the power of vengeance, hatred, and division. We tap into that each and every time we ask for forgiveness or extend it to another.

How beautiful our hearts become when they become accustomed to frequent forgiveness! How joyful and attractive become our marriages, families, and parish communities! How light our souls feel when unburdened by the habit of keeping score.

Challenge: Name one thing, small or large, for which you could ask forgiveness from someone in your life. Then do it.

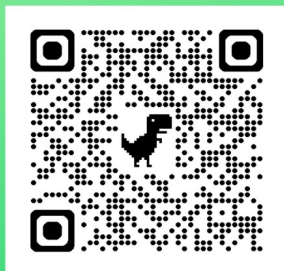

Assisted Listening Systems for Church Sound

Our church is equipped with a hearing "loop" system which will allow those with a tele-coil (T-coil) in their hearing aid to hear more clearly. Some hearing aids will automatically switch to our "loop" system. Other hearing aids must be *manually* switched to the T-coil mode.

If you do not think your hearing aid is functioning properly with our "loop" system it may be because: A) Your hearing aid does not have a built-in T-coil OR B) You have to *manually* switch your hearing aid to the T-coil mode.

T-Coil Switches: If your hearing aid has a switch labeled **M-T-O** the switch should be set to the **T** position. If your hearing aid has switch labeled **M-MT** the switch should be set to the **MT** position.

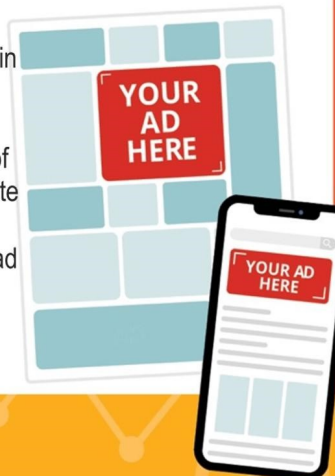
Please consult your Audiologist with any questions, and to be sure that your hearing aid is equipped with a T-coil and is working properly.

If you do not have a hearing aid with tele-coil (T-coil), we have purchased four individual hearing devices, specifically programmed for our system, that can be used during our liturgies on Sunday. They will be placed in a box on the bench outside the school office. We do ask that you please clean the hearing device after Mass, with the alcohol wipes that are on the bench, before returning them to the box. Thank you and we hope this will help to enhance your liturgical experience.
