to hand on your gifts to future generations*

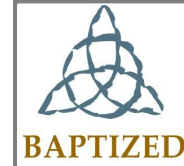

### SCRIPTURE REFLECTION



When I was a wet-behind-the-ears seminarian, I was sent for an immersion with the poor. For one month, I lived in a home for adults with developmental disabilities. It was a challenge for me because the residents had significant communication issues. A 30-year-old man there named Robin was totally deaf and mute. He had Down's Syndrome. He looked like a Viking, with a shock of red hair and a fine beard. But I felt awkward and disconnected from him. All my normal ways of interacting failed. I resigned myself to the fact that we'd never connect.

Then one morning something amazing happened. He was on the living room floor quietly playing with toys. Watching him from a chair, I sensed Jesus' words float into my mind, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me" (Mark 9:37). I thought, "Jesus, you must somehow be in Robin." I sheepishly made sure no one else was in the room, and then I spoke in a clear voice: "Jesus, are you there?" Robin did not turn to me and say, "Hi, John. Yes, it's me, Jesus." He kept playing with his toys in silence.

But something changed in me. From that moment on, it was easier to just be with Robin, to joke around with him, to try sign-language with him, to let him be himself, and for me to be myself. His "disabilities" were no longer obstacles to overcome. He became just Robin, my friend.

Who in your life seems awkwardly distant or uncomfortable to be with? Next time you see him or her, quietly invoke the name of Jesus, and see how the barriers disappear in you.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

All of us have benefited in so many ways from the ministry of priests who have served us in the Archdiocese of Chicago. Before their ordination, these priests prepared over a course of years to serve us. Today, seminarians, when ordained, will be serving your children, grandchildren and great grandchildren. Some are in the pre-seminary spiritual year at Bishop Quarter House in the city. Others are completing their college studies at the University of St. Thomas in Saint Paul, Minnesota. Finally, those in the last four-year phase of preparation, are being formed at Mundelein Seminary.

Supporting vocations to the priesthood is a task that belongs to all of us in the Church. I want to invite you to express that support in four ways: pray for vocations and our seminarians in preparation, encourage those seminarians serving in your parish, urge young men to give their lives in service as priests, and make a financial contribution to support our programs of priestly formation. **The daily 40 Days for Life vigil will take place on the public right of way in front of Flossmoor Planned Parenthood from 8am to 6pm Sept 25th through Nov 3rd.**

The prayerful presence of 40 Days for Life campaigns in front of abortion clinics twice a year over time has led to many abortion clinics closing because of the decline in abortions during the vigils and the doubts which have been planted in the minds of Planned Parenthood workers, including clinic managers. The vigil will consist of a quiet, peaceful prayer presence on the public right of way in front of the clinic. Public parking is available 1/2 block north of the Planned Parenthood site on 198th St. which goes west from Governors Hwy, or along the alley that runs east from Governor's Hwy behind the Vollmer Road strip mall.

## Hope's On The Way Buckets of Hope 2024 Campaign

Each year, the deacons of the Archdiocese of Chicago along with lay volunteers serving in the Hope's On The Way (HOTW) Ministry deliver Buckets of Hope filled with emergency cleaning supplies to victims of natural disasters throughout the United States. HOTW has shipped over 6,700 buckets to people stricken by hurricanes, tornadoes and flooding in locations including Texas, Louisiana, Alabama, Illinois and many others. HOTW relies on the generosity of parishioners to support this ministry by either donating money to HOTW to have HOTW volunteers purchase cleaning supplies, or parishioners can purchase the specified cleaning supplies to fill five-gallon buckets that HOTW provides and picks up.

For those parishioners who prefer to fill HOTW Buckets, here is the process:

- Pickup empty five gallon buckets with the list of cleaning supplies after all Masses the weekend of **September 22<sup>nd</sup>**
- Purchase the cleaning supplies (typically around \$30 per bucket), fill the buckets, and return the filled buckets to Church
- Filled buckets are due back at Church no later than **October 13<sup>th</sup>**

**Assisted Listening Systems for Church Sound**

Our church is equipped with a hearing “loop” system which will allow those with a tele-coil (T-coil) in their hearing aid to hear more clearly. Some hearing aids will automatically switch to our “loop” system. Other hearing aids must be *manually* switched to the T-coil mode.

If you do not think your hearing aid is functioning properly with our “loop” system it may be because: A) Your hearing aid does not have a built-in T-coil OR B) You have to *manually* switch your hearing aid to the T-coil mode.

**T-Coil Switches:** If your hearing aid has a switch labeled **M-T-O** the switch should be set to the **T** position. If your hearing aid has switch labeled **M-MT** the switch should be set to the **MT** position.

Please consult your Audiologist with any questions, and to be sure that your hearing aid is equipped with a T-coil and is working properly.

If you do not have a hearing aid with tele-coil (T-coil), we have purchased four individual hearing devices, specifically programmed for our system, that can be used during our liturgies on Sunday. They will be placed in a box on the bench outside the school office. We do ask that you please clean the hearing device after Mass, with the alcohol wipes that are on the bench, before returning them to the box. Thank you and we hope this will help to enhance your liturgical experience.
