

Above is the Financial Report for the Fiscal Year 2024, which is July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024. This is a great report. As you can see, the parish surplus exceeded expenses by \$75,232.37. Please remember that we made many improvements this past year which included the completion of the remodeling of rooms 311 and 312 into a larger meeting space. Also, this year's report includes the payments for last summer's tuckpointing and new gym/parish center roof. This also includes the removal of trees around our property, other landscaping improvements, new bathroom partitions in four washrooms within the school/gym, and other improvements to our buildings to ensure they are safe and updated.

Please know that we do not have outstanding loans with the Archdiocese of Chicago or any financial institution, and we are currently up to date with all bills. Thank you very much for your generosity which keeps our parish growing and enables us to keep up with the improvements that are needed on and keep our ministries growing at St. Alexander.

I ask that all parishioners please encourage friends, family, and others you meet if they are searching for a church to tell them to register at St. Alexander. Once again, thank you for all your spiritual and financial support to St. Alexander parish and its many ministries.

# SCRIPTURE REFLECTION



As a young pastor years ago, I met with a middle-aged couple who had been divorced and civilly remarried. They were frustrated that an annulment had to precede a Church marriage. Sympathizing with their plight, I promised to walk with them along their journey. Once as we sat in my office, the man said to me, "Why is the Church so difficult on marriage?" I replied, "Actually, Jesus' teaching is what's difficult." He furrowed his brow and asked what I meant.

We opened the Bible and together read today's gospel passage from Mark 10:12 in which Jesus says, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another, commits adultery with her..." My two friends sat in silent astonishment. Surely Jesus understands the complexities of human life and sexual love. The words hung thick and heavy in the air. How could the merciful Lord be so seemingly unrealistic in his expectations, especially with so much divorce and remarriage in our world?

I didn't know what to say. So, we kept reading. Next, Jesus says, "Let the children come to me." The innocence of children allows them to receive and give love, to trust unconditionally, to believe in love that endures. Most children aren't yet jaded by statistics, broken hearts, or dysfunctional relationships. Children remind us of the world to come. The couple and I began to talk about child-like trust in Jesus and his teaching, and we continued to move forward. When it comes to the Church's demanding teaching on marriage, it's best to approach it as trusting children, whatever situations in which we find ourselves.







May we remain in the holy company of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the apostles, and all the saints. May their example and presence inspire us with patient confidence in the work of your grace.



# Opportunity for Spiritual Direction

Christion Spiritual Direction is an ancient spiritual discipline that is a way of companioning

people as they seek to look closely, through the eyes of their heart, at the guidance and transforming work of God in their lives. Direction is given by one believer to another and helps the seeker to respond to the Holy Spirit's communication by living out this relationship with God. The focus of this type of spiritual direction is on experience, not ideas, and specifically on the religious dimension of experience.

Moreover, experiences are viewed as an expression of the ongoing personal relationship God has established with each one of us. The director is considered a gentle guide in this process. Spiritual direction meetings take place once a month in a one on one setting. Prayer, silence, and listening are used to assist the seeker in discerning the movement of the Holy Spirit in their lives. All conversations take place in strict confidentiality.

# Hope's On The Way Buckets of Hope 2024 Campaign

Each year, the deacons of the Archdiocese of Chicago along with lay volunteers serving in the Hope's On The Way (HOTW) Ministry deliver Buckets of Hope filled with emergency cleaning supplies to victims of natural disasters throughout the United States. HOTW has shipped over 6,700 buckets to people stricken by hurricanes, tornadoes and flooding in locations including Texas, Louisiana, Alabama, Illinois and many others. HOTW relies on the generosity of parishioners to support this ministry by either donating money to HOTW to have HOTW volunteers purchase cleaning supplies, or parishioners can purchase the specified cleaning supplies to fill five-gallon buckets that HOTW provides and picks up.

For those parishioners who prefer to fill HOTW Buckets, here is the process:

- Pickup empty five gallon buckets with the list of cleaning supplies after all Masses the weekend of September 22<sup>nd</sup>
- Purchase the cleaning supplies (typically around \$30 per bucket), fill the buckets, and return the filled buckets to Church
- Filled buckets are due back at Church no later than October 13<sup>th</sup>
