

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Many thanks to St. Alexander's Knights of Columbus and St. Vincent de Paul who sponsored our Holiday Food Drive and to all our parishioners that were so generous in donating food this year. Due to your caring generosity many families received a nourishing meal in order to celebrate Thanksgiving. Many times we take the gifts and possessions that we have for granted when many people in our own country, and throughout the world, are homeless and are hungry each and every day. As Pope Francis reminds us, we must always remember those who are less fortunate than ourselves and share our gifts with our neighbor.

On page five of our bulletin is the schedule of our Christmas Masses and liturgies for our Christmas season. Due to popular demand we have two 3:00PM Masses on Christmas, one in the church and one in the parish center. This year January 1st is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses will be celebrated Wednesday evening, December 31st at 5:00PM and Thursday, January 1st at 10:00AM.

Oplatki, the Christmas Wafer, is available in the back of church and for purchase at the parish office. The donation is \$3.00.

Let us remember we as Christians and Catholics are not only celebrating Holy Days this time of year. December 14th through December 22nd our Jewish brothers and sisters are celebrating their holiday of Hanukkah. Hanukkah is popularly known as the Feast of Lights, though it's Hebrew title more accurately means "dedication". It commemorates the Jewish people's victory in the first recorded battle for religious liberty. Hanukkah recalls the Maccabees, who in 167 B.C. lead a small guerilla army of Jews against the overwhelming might of their Syrian rulers in a struggle to the death for the right to worship God in their own traditional way. It is a valiant story, but Jewish tradition was hesitant about transforming a military triumph into a religious celebration.

The Rabbis therefore preferred to emphasize the spiritual aspects of the Maccabean war. Thus, the title of Hanukkah means "dedication" and refers to the rededication of the ancient temple, a final spiritual act in which the victorious Jewish army cleansed the Temple of the idols with which the Syrians had stocked it, while their army was occupying the temple mount. After the victorious war a miracle occurred by which the eternal light of the temple precinct, which had been put out by the Syrians, was rekindled and remained burning for eight days. This happened even though the oil available was sufficient for only one day. Eight days later new oil arrived by messenger and the miracle ceased. This is why Hanukkah lasts eight days.

Though Hanukkah may be a "minor" Jewish holiday in theory, more Jews keep Hanukkah than any other Jewish festival. For eight straight evenings the entire Jewish family gathers to light the eight branch Hanukkah candelabrum known as the Menorah, after which its members exchange gifts. The family spends the night by eating special foods, playing Hanukkah games, or just remaining around the lit Menorah. It is a time to celebrate family, love, friends, and the miracle of the burning temple flame of years ago.

As we celebrate Christmas this year let us make sure we respect the faith and traditions of our Jewish brothers and sisters. The more we understand other faiths the sooner we will have peace on earth and an end to war and religious violence. Jesus Christ is the savior of all people and has brought salvation to all people whether they believe in his divinity or not.

It's Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday!



Light the third (rose-colored) candle on your Advent wreath. On Gaudete Sunday, the season of Advent shifts its focus. For the first two weeks of Advent, the focus can be summed up in the phrase, "The Lord is coming." But beginning with Gaudete Sunday, the summary might be, "The Lord is near." This shift is marked by a lighter mood and a heightened sense of joyous anticipation. Liturgically, the colors lighten as well. The priest usually wears rose-colored vestments, a hue seen only on Gaudete Sunday and Laetare Sunday. In times when the focus of our anticipation is often on the negative and fearful, this celebration is a reminder that God who loves us is still in charge and that we await his coming not with fear, but with tremendous joy.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION



When I was 11, I was riding my bike on a Friday night in Scottsdale, Arizona. I saw giant spotlights swirling in the sky. Something amazing had to be happening. I pedaled after them with excitement. Sweaty and tired, I arrived, only to find a used car lot. Bright lights, flapping banners, inflatable balloon men swaying wildly in the wind. I stood there, heart sinking. All that spectacle, and all my effort ... for this?

As life proceeds, we learn what it is like to pursue promising but fruitless searches. This week we hear Jesus ask the crowds regarding John the Baptist: "What did you go out to the desert to see? A reed swayed by the wind?" (Matthew 11:7). He's not just describing the crowd's mis-aimed pursuit. He's naming our tendency to chase after what's flashy but flimsy.

What are our swaying reeds? For me, it is endless video reels on my phone, worldly pleasures, entertainment in sports, and the good opinion of others. Inflated distractions that bend whichever way the wind blows. But they can't satisfy my soul. What are your flimsy reeds?

John the Baptist wasn't a swaying reed. He was rooted, grounded, unafraid to speak the solid truth. The people went to see him because, deep down, they were starving for something real.

This Advent, the Church asks us to reassess: What are we really looking for? Are we chasing the dazzling but hollow? Or are we seeking what is solid and lasting — that which points to Christ?

Assisted Listening Systems for Church Sound

Our church is equipped with a hearing “loop” system which will allow those with a tele-coil (T-coil) in their hearing aid to hear more clearly. Some hearing aids will automatically switch to our “loop” system. Other hearing aids must be *manually* switched to the T-coil mode.

If you do not think your hearing aid is functioning properly with our “loop” system it may be because: A) Your hearing aid does not have a built-in T-coil OR B) You have to *manually* switch your hearing aid to the T-coil mode.

T-Coil Switches: If your hearing aid has a switch labeled **M-T-O** the switch should be set to the **T** position. If your hearing aid has switch labeled **M-MT** the switch should be set to the **MT** position.

Please consult your Audiologist with any questions, and to be sure that your hearing aid is equipped with a T-coil and is working properly.

If you do not have a hearing aid with tele-coil (T-coil), we have purchased four individual hearing devices, specifically programmed for our system, that can be used during our liturgies on Sunday. They will be placed in a box on the bench outside the school office. We do ask that you please clean the hearing device after Mass, with the alcohol wipes that are on the bench, before returning them to the box. Thank you and we hope this will help to enhance your liturgical experience.
