

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

We refer to our Lord Jesus Christ as the Bread of Life, Christ the King, The Prince of Peace, Christ Our Savior, Lamb of God, and many other titles. One of the beautiful terms we use when we refer to Jesus is The Good Shepherd. What a loving, caring, and nurturing term for Jesus as we realize He is always watching and protecting, we, His sheep. We are never lost when we follow The Good Shepherd. Jesus shepherds us out of love, and not out of duty, like a hired hand.

The difference between The Good Shepherd and the hired hand is the difference between life and death. Unlike a hired hand who only works for pay and would run away at the first sign of difficulty, Jesus is a Good Shepherd who willingly lays down his life for his sheep. The Good Shepherd draws the sheep near to him. They belong to him—not as a possession that can be discarded, but as precious ones who are assured that they can rely on His care and protection. The sheep owe their very lives to the Shepherd. Without him, they will be scattered and left on their own in what is often a dangerous world.

No sheep with any sense would wander off and leave the fold. The Shepherd provides food and safety. Away from the fold, the sheep risks death in the jaws of wolves or starvation in the desert. Jesus is The Good Shepherd and invites us to be good sheep. Jesus has experienced the best and the worst of all that life has in store. He has known the simple joys and deep disappointments of life; he has known temptation, anxiety, and fatigue. Jesus walks ahead of us, leading the way. We may be tempted to wander away, lured by the temporary pleasures and tempted by the illusion of something better over the horizon. In the noise of daily life, surrounded by messages that compete with God and God's ways, it is easy to become distracted from what is important and lasting. Jesus, our Good Shepherd, invites us to be good sheep who are so close to him that we hear and recognize his voice. As good sheep, we are called to follow the voice of the Shepherd, trusting that he will guide us to the best pasture, where we can thrive.

Please remember our school children will continue to ask for your support for this year's Raider Run/Walk to be held on Thursday evening, May 9th. All proceeds of this event will benefit our school technology department. St. Alexander School has one of the best computer/tech departments in the Archdiocese of Chicago which enables us to better instruct our children. With technology constantly changing this fundraiser is vital to keeping our equipment and systems up to date.

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION



Recently I was with my little dog Libby at a retreat center in the Arizona desert. I sat in a chair near a ravine filled with shrubs. Unbeknownst to me, Libby wandered down there and disappeared. Suddenly an animal's wild shriek erupted from the area. Without thinking, I bolted down into the ravine fully expecting to see coyotes, javelinas, or rattlesnakes. I didn't care. I desperately wanted to get Libby out of there, without any self-regard. Before I could face whatever danger lay hidden, my dog blissfully trotted out from an entirely different area, utterly unaware that I had (quite heroically) just placed my life on the line.

When the adrenaline wore off, I thought to myself: how far would I have been willing to go to save her? I don't know. But I do know, if I had literally died, my friends and family would have certainly thought me insane for dying for a dog. No offense, Libby.

How passionately Jesus wants us to know him and his willingness to die for us! This week he says, "I know my own and my own know me," and "I lay down my life for the sheep." Here we encounter an insanely excessive love for us. Christianity is a relationship and not simply a religion or ethical code. In Jesus, God rescues and saves us. He laid down his life for you and me — and he has taken it up again. So often we are like Libby — blissfully ignorant of the reality of both our spiritual danger and his saving love. This Easter season, the risen Jesus calls us to be more conscious than ever before about his love. He never ceases to lay down his life for us.



Creation Care Corner

**Carbon Pricing:
A Catholic Solution for Climate?**

Following in the footsteps of Pope John Paul II and Benedict XVI, Pope Francis recognizes the scientific consensus that the current problematic warming trend is mostly caused by human activity. Deforestation and burning fossil fuels are major contributors. While some have wrongly turned climate change into a political issue, Pope Francis recognizes it as a social justice and a moral issue. This is because those who will suffer most from the resulting environmental damage are the poor and future generations ... who are least responsible for contributing to the problem.

Francis has called upon individuals, governments, and corporations to make changes to mitigate the problem. He met with top energy company executives who agreed to consider supporting government policies that put a price on carbon. Also in 2019, the US Conference of Catholic Bishops had issued a statement of support for legislation that is now called the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act (H.R. 5744) that would price carbon emissions to encourage a faster transition to cleaner energy. It would do so in a way that minimizes economic harm to the poor and middle class. Francis himself stated "... carbon pricing is essential if humanity is to use the resources of creation wisely."

Because human suffering will be significant if we fail to adequately address the climate problem, immediate action is required. Carbon pricing could be a part of the solution.

Assisted Listening Systems for Church Sound

Our church is equipped with a hearing "loop" system which will allow those with a tele-coil (T-coil) in their hearing aid to hear more clearly. Some hearing aids will automatically switch to our "loop" system. Other hearing aids must be *manually* switched to the T-coil mode.

If you do not think your hearing aid is functioning properly with our "loop" system it may be because: A) Your hearing aid does not have a built-in T-coil OR B) You have to *manually* switch your hearing aid to the T-coil mode.

T-Coil Switches: If your hearing aid has a switch labeled **M-T-O** the switch should be set to the **T** position. If your hearing aid has switch labeled **M-MT** the switch should be set to the **MT** position.

Please consult your Audiologist with any questions, and to be sure that your hearing aid is equipped with a T-coil and is working properly.

If you do not have a hearing aid with tele-coil (T-coil), we have purchased four individual hearing devices, specifically programmed for our system, that can be used during our liturgies on Sunday. They will be placed in a box on the bench outside the school office. We do ask that you please clean the hearing device after Mass, with the alcohol wipes that are on the bench, before returning them to the box. Thank you and we hope this will help to enhance your liturgical experience.
